



does not follow CP1250, since it is aimed at maintaining compatibility with its Macintosh fonts and lacks keyboard support.

At present, Kappa Type's East European fonts appear to be the best buy for the user who wants to get up and running quickly in an East European language, while adhering to existing Windows standards. Kappa Type is currently working on Macintosh versions of these fonts, and is planning a CP1257 font series, but there is no expected shipping date for these products. 🌐
